Her Story

Born the 11th day of January, 1950 in Chicago, Illinois, Rose Marie Malone-Jenkins was sent here to be a special woman of God who would impact many lives naturally as well as spiritually.

Rose attended Cooley High School in Chicago, and furthered her education at Olive Harvey Community College.

“Rose Marie” (as she was so sweetly referred to by many loved ones) was a well-rounded “leader” in whatever circle she found herself in, working in multiple industries and finally retiring from the healthcare field. She left home at an early age to become engaged to and marry Mr. Charles Ammons, (known as “Buddy” by most) together they conceived the best son one could ask for, Charles Lamar Ammons Jr.

The Ammons family lived in various neighborhoods throughout the city of Chicago with the infamous Cabrini Green housing project being their final place of residence in the city where Rose thrived amongst many family members and friends. Some of the relationships developed there lasted up until Rose’s final days. You could easily find her reminiscing on the phone with many family/friends from Cabrini including her childhood best friend named “Faye” whom she loved dearly.

Rose Marie nurtured her one and only son for as long as she could until she decided that the violence plagued area they lived in was too dangerous to continue to raise him there so she developed a plan to get him out of harm’s way. Just as the mother of Moses prepared a basket to carry Moses to safety, Rose Marie used the CTA bus to transport her son to the safety of the suburbs where her mother and father lived. She would later join him and move there herself.

Sister Rose was raised in the Church of God In Christ by her parents at a young age singing in the choir, performing various church duties etc. But when she decided to fully commit and yield her heart to God she became a wonderful woman of God under the leadership of her late uncle Pastor Elder James McGee, her Father Pastor Elder Columbus Malone, Pastor Elder James R. Adams, and finally Bishop Ocie Booker. Once she received the baptism of the Holy Ghost, she received power and became the witness spoken of in Acts 1:8.

She led numerous souls to Christ, testifying about God’s ability to transform and change lives. The health conditions she battled did not stop her from telling of God’s goodness to her roommates and the hospital staff in both South Suburban or Ingalls hospitals during her numerous stays. She would be found outside of her room sitting in the halls talking to different ones about God’s only begotten Son. Even while attending the dialysis center she made friends and talked about the goodness of God while being transported to and from the center. She was a powerful and sanctified vessel in God’s hands.

Sister Jenkins is survived by her only son, Elder Charles L. Ammons, her Sister Veetrice (Vince) and three brothers, Emmanuel (Debra), Nate, and Joseph Malone as well as a host of grandchildren, great grandchildren, nieces and nephews.

She is preceded in death by her parents Columbus and Archie Malone, her sisters Audrey Malone and Mary Lawson, her brothers Larry, Columbus Jr, and Nehemiah Malone.
