Mother Parker was born on the 12th of December, year of our Lord 1932 in the city of Grenada, Mississippi. She was born the ninth child of eleven children of Elder James Carter and Mother Alberta Carter. Betty was raised in the strong Christian family of the Church of God in Christ as Elder Carter was a pastor of two churches. She accepted the Lord as her personal Savior at an early age. She graduated from Grenada High School, afterwards joining the United State Air Force completing her service with an honorable discharge with the rank of First Sergeant.

Mother Parker began a long career in medicine, beginning at Wesley Memorial Hospital in Chicago, Illinois as a Licensed Certified Pharmaceutical Technician; later she became employed with Cook County Hospital of Chicago. She retired from the Jesse Brown Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center of Chicago.

Mother Parker met the true love of her life, Mr. Elmer Parker, in Chicago. Three beautiful children were blessed to this union, Sharie Lynn, Lawrence and Robert. Their children were raised in the fear and admonition of the Lord.

Mother Parker became affiliated with St. John Church of God in Christ of Chicago in the early 1960's under the late Elder Will A. Toland, Pastor. She served under the following successive pastors: Elder Elihue Bell and Superintendent I.C. Grover. She was a faithful servant who loved to sing and was very active as a senior choir member, a member of the C.H. Mason District choir and the First Jurisdiction Illinois choir. She eventually served on the nurses' board at her local church and the jurisdictional board. She served on the communion committee and was a member of The Mothers of Zion Women's Fellowship.

Mother Parker also strongly supported Spring Forth Ministries of Chicago founded by Pastor Shary Baldwin.

Mother Parker in later years became affiliated with Reed's Temple COGIC of Griffith, IN, under Elder Joe Reed and Superintendent David Reed; later attending Abounding Life COGIC of Posen, IL, under Elder James Adams. She eventually placed her membership with the New Generation COGIC under Elder Melford Cartwright where she served on the Mother's Board. She enjoyed making her southern gumbo for Pastor Cartwright who she truly adored and who loved her dearly.

Mother Parker loved to be fashionable, she loved to be pampered and she enjoyed good cuisine. She had a great sense of humor and she was very outspoken, one always knew how she felt and where she stood.






