Julia Elaine Brown was born November 29, 1948, in Chicago, IL to the union of James Tad Brown and Vernell Moore Brown. Her parents and two brothers, William Brown and Michael Brown, preceded her in death. Julia also had one sister-in-law, Willa Mae Brown, one brother-in-law, Frank Bragg, and one nephew, Darryl Brown, who preceded her in death.

Julia was educated in the Chicago Public School System. She was a graduate of John Marshall High School on the west side of Chicago, IL. Julia pursued a career at the United States Post Office until her health prevented her. She later dedicated many years of service to the Institute for Scholastic Achievement (ISA).

At the tender age of 24, Julia Brown accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at the Old Landmark Church of God Holiness in Christ #1 under the leadership of the late Apostle Robert L. Mitchell. She continued her membership under the leadership of Bishop Lary Schiefelbusch. Missionary Julia Brown, was one of the most loving, caring, considerate, compassionate, and faithful sisters in the Lord. She ministered and interceded for many through prayer and wrote many inspiring poems, for which she became affectionally known as "The Poet." She taught in our convocation seminars and Church School, served as a member of both the Beautifying Committee and the Church Choir, supported many fund raisers by cooking and baking delicious cakes and cookies, and by giving financially. She recently served as the Assistant Teacher for the Church School conference call with Evangelist Beverly Willis. In her later years she became homebound but continued her work for the ministry by way of various phone conference call lines. She remained faithful until she received in her own words, "An Honorable Discharge in the army of my Lord."

On Friday, September 6, 2024, Julia Elaine Brown met her appointed time, with her "Holy armor on. To God be all the Glory!"
