CELEBRATING A LIFE

LYNN TABOR

SUNRISE FEBRUARY 10, 1960 SUNSET: SEPTEMBER 10, 2024



Sharon Lynn Tabor was born at Cook County Hospital in Chicago on February 10, 1960, to Eli and Willie Mae Tabor (both of whom preceded her in death). Sharon, fondly known to the family as 'Penni," was brought home to Robbins, Illinois and was raised there. Robbins always held a special place in Penni's heart, and she described her childhood there as beautiful and safe, a loving community that was hardworking, resourceful, and caring. Penni was very proud that her home town, one of the first African American governed communities in the United States, had its own police, fire, and water services, as well as black owned banks, restaurants, diners, grocery stores, corner stores, laundry mats, schools, theaters, and churches. Robbins even had its own airport -- the first black owned/operated airport in the United States.

Penni also frequently spoke about how nearly all the families in Robbins had their own garden, and that the town was filled with fruit trees. She recalled eating apples, cherries, strawberries, pears, and blackberries right off the trees, and tomatoes, walnuts, and sugar cane they'd eat straight out of the ground. There was fresh chicken to be had back in those days too; dinner was often walking around in the backyard that very day!

Penni attended Lincoln Memorial Grade School, and Thomas J. Kellar Middle School in Robbins, and graduated from Dwight D. Eisenhower High School in Blue Island.

Among other passions, Penni loved sports and enjoyed music, traveling, studying the bible, biblical history, and ministering salvation to young people. She confessed her faith and accepted the Lord as her personal Savior at an early age, something her parents instilled in all the children while growing up. Her baptism actually took place in the River Jordan in Fremont, California, administered by an ordained pastor at Calvary Church, also located in Fremont. In the early 2000s, Penni attended Los Medanos College in Pittsburg, California, focusing primarily on early child education courses, achieving academic honors. Penni also loved teaching, caring for and working with children. She and Karen were cofoster parents, and fostered three young boys (one five-years old and later two toddler brothers) all under the age of six, for a total of approximately three years.

Penni was adventurous, had many talents (mechanical and technological, in particular), and held many different types of jobs, from being a Jiffy Lube Service technician, to handling calls at the Antioch police department, working on assembly lines, a job at World's Finest Chocolates, and several security positions. Her favorite employer, however, was Silicon Graphics Computer Systems (SGI), an American high-performance hardware and software company in the Bay Area. Penni held several positions at SGI in California, Chicago, and Wisconsin, excelling at and recruited into higher positions in each of them. She started with SGI in ~1994, and continued there until the company closed its doors about 2004.

Penni was the second youngest of 7 children. Two brothers, Jerry Williams and Robert Lee Tabor, and one sister, Josephine Tabor, preceded her in death. Penni transitioned from this world on September 10, 2024. She leaves to cherish her memory three sisters, Elaine (William) Moore, Willie Mae Tabor, and Diane Tabor, her "adopted" sister in life, Karen Clay Broome, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
