

Frank Douglas Price was born on April 15, 1936, the fourth child of Veola and Frank Calloway Price. Frank grew up in Columbus, Texas and graduated from what was known as the "Colored" High School. He was loved by his peers and teachers.

Frank served in the Air Force from 1956–1960. After moving to Chicago, he worked until retirement at the Toys R Us warehouse. One to not be idle, he then worked for the Chicago Park District at Ogden Park.

Frank gave his life to Christ under the leadership of Bishop Emery Lindsay at Christ Temple Cathedral, where he began to serve faithfully. Frank loved Psalm 91; his favorite song was "Safe in Beulah."
