


MOM, I MISS YOU

TASHA LASHAWN LADD, the oldest of two daughters was born on April 22, 1976, to Henry and Patricia Ladd at the Albert Merritt Billings Hospital (a University of Chicago Hospital) in Chicago Illinois. Her father preceded her in death.

SHE graduated from Higgins Community Academy, (an Elementary School in Chicago, Illinois) in 1990. SHE attended Thronton Fractional South High School in Thornton, Illinois and later, in 1994 graduated from Rich South Campus High School, in Richton Park, Illinois. SHE was well aware of the importance of education and acquired her Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting/Finance from Governors State University in University Park, Illinois in 2006. Later TASHA acquired two Master's Degrees: one in Criminal Fraud Examiner and the second in Accountancy – both at the Keller Graduate School of Management, Devry University in Illinois.

While growing up, TASHA (nick-named "Tuda" by her aunts and uncles) was always concerned about family, learning how SHE could make them feel better bringing a smile to their faces. Her childhood was simple. Yet becoming an adult was meaningful. TASHA was a member of New Faith Baptist Church International, in Matteson, Illinois. SHE loved "being there" for her family; listening to jazz music; starting her days and ending her nights in prayer; working jobs in her career as an Accountant; spending time with her friends (of over thirty years, named "Sistah Circle") and their families; and most importantly, raising her son Joseph, who SHE affectionately called Joe.

Speaking of Joseph...There was no doubt that the best day of her life was on September 1, 2012, when SHE gave birth to him, her only child. TASHA was passionate about Joseph's growing to be an intelligent, responsible, positively productive young man. SHE taught him values to be respectful to adults, loyal to himself, and loyal to his friends. TASHA stressed that Joseph learn all he could in whatever he's interested in; when talking to or with anyone, use words that help, not word that hurt their feelings; complete all tasks once started; and live to always be a better person. These were the same qualities TASHA lived by. SHE poured all of herself into him keeping Joseph busy. His regular schedule included completing schoolwork; participating in different sports, namely football, basketball and Taekwondo; helping around the house and her when needed; etc. Whatever Joseph wanted to try, TASHA made sure his wishes were fulfilled.
